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STAR Savings

Earn rebates for appliances with ENERGY STAR rating

Is a large appliance such as a refrigerator or clothes washer on your shopping list? Then be sure to look for the ENERGY STAR logo to save money now and in the future.

To encourage our members to make energy-smart purchases, Nolin offers rebates ranging from \$50 to \$300 for major appliances that have earned the ENERGY STAR rating. Qualifying appliances include freezers, dishwashers, clothes washers, and refrigerators (greater than 7.75 cubic feet). Rebates are also available for heat pump water heaters, air source heat pumps, and central air conditioners.

Know the difference

Before you shop, be sure you understand the difference in labels you'll find on new appliances. Most appliances will have a yellow Energy Guide label, but that does not indicate that it has earned an ENERGY STAR rating. It pays to know the difference since only those with the ENERGY STAR rating

can earn a rebate from Nolin.

The ENERGY STAR logo is on all qualified products that meet specific standards for energy efficiency. ENERGY STAR qualified products exceed the federal minimum standards for efficiency and quality — sometimes significantly. Look for the logo on major appliances and water heaters.

The bright yellow and black Energy Guide label, which the federal government requires most appliances to display, helps you determine whether an appliance is energy efficient. Energy Guide ratings for appliances will show their typical usage in kilowatt-hours per year. The lower the energy number, the more cost efficient it is to run. These labels will not show you which appliance is the most efficient on the market.

Before you buy, remember that an appliance labeled “energy efficient” may be low-energy rated, but may not meet the standards to be an ENERGY

STAR product. Choose an ENERGY STAR-rated product to earn both a rebate now and for exceptional energy savings over the life of the appliance.

Know how to shut off your electricity

If you have a gas or plumbing leak, you might need to shut off your home's electricity as well as the gas and water.

You can turn the electricity off inside your circuit breaker panel or fuse box. You would usually do this only in an extreme emergency.

Before you're faced with an emergency, locate your box. It might be in a utility closet, garage, or the basement. It's a metal box full of switches or fuses.

If your box is full of switches, they control your home's electrical circuits. To turn your electricity off, turn all of the switches to the "off" position, and then switch off the main switch at the top.

Two cautions:

- If your floor is flooded or if the electrical panel is wet, do not touch the panel.
- If you see exposed wires inside the box, do not touch them. In both cases, call an electrician to handle this dangerous task.

Don't flip the main switch except during an emergency. If you're having a problem with electricity in a particular room or with one appliance, you can flip the switch that powers just that area. Often, you'll find that the individual switch is "off," and you can solve the problem by turning it back on.



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Putting safety first

May is dedicated to National Electrical Safety Month

Officially summer begins June 20. But in these parts, May usually heralds the start of summer as temperatures begin to warm and cheerful flowers pop into bloom. It's a beautiful month.

May is also a great month for another reason: May is National Electrical Safety Month—an entire month dedicated to raising awareness about electrical hazards.

Nolin RECC knows the electric service we provide is now a necessity and is always there. You really don't think much when flipping a switch or plugging in an appliance. But you should think. To paraphrase a quote—electricity is a useful servant but a terrible master—unless it is used with safety in mind.

Coordinated by the Electrical Safety Foundation International, the theme for this year's National Electrical Safety Month is "At Home and at Work: Make Electrical Safety Everyone's Priority." Find out more at ESFI.org.

Follow these 10 tips on how to safely avoid common mistakes made with electricity:

1 A downed power line does not mean it is dead. Stay far away and notify your electric utility immediately.

2 Never plug a generator into a wall outlet. Dangerous backfeed (where power flows in opposite direction from its usual flow) sends electricity back through power lines and can injure or kill the lineman trying to restore power.

3 Don't step into a flooded basement—water may be in contact with outlets or electrical cords. The water of a flooded basement may be energized with electricity.

4 Water and electrical equipment don't mix. Replace appliances damaged by water because they are unsafe to use, and never use electrical equipment in wet conditions.

5 Put GFCIs in all outlets. Ground-fault circuit interrupters (GFCIs) monitor electricity flow in a circuit. If there is an irregularity, the power cuts off, preventing an electric shock.

6 Never use extension cords permanently. When using them for a permanent solution, they can overheat and cause fires.

7 Never remove a plug's grounding pin. The third prong on a plug is a safety feature. If the plug doesn't fit, the outlet needs to be replaced.

8 Take care of electrical cords. Never tack or nail a cord to any surface or run across traffic paths or under rugs. Check cords occasionally for damage; replace when necessary.

9 Avoid overloading outlets. Plugging in too many appliances to an outlet can strain your electrical system.

10 Always call 811 before digging. Find out where your utilities are marked so you know where it is safe to dig.

The Co-op Connections Card continues to be one of the most popular cards in your wallet. And when you pull this card out and use it, you don't pay any service or interest fees. In fact, members save money by using the Co-op Connections Card, which is a benefit provided exclusively to cooperative members.

Last year, the Co-op Connections Card saved Nolin members over \$42,000 on prescription medicine. Since January 2016, members using the card have saved an average of 59 percent on prescriptions.

Three years ago we introduced the Healthy Savings program, which offers members discounts on eye care, dental care, chiropractic visits, lab tests, imaging scans, and hearing aids in addition to the prescription discounts.

In January, the Co-op Connections Card began offering Identity Theft Protection to members. For \$5 a month for individual coverage or \$8 for a family, ID Sanctuary offers fraud and credit monitoring that scours billions of records and sources. If something changes, subscribers receive an alert. And if your


identity is stolen, the service also provides help in resolving the issue.

The card also offers discounts at many local, state, and national businesses and restaurants. The number of businesses participating in the Co-op Connections Card discounts increases daily.


